ST. CATHARINES, Ont. (CP) — For 25 years, Orphie Easson of St. Catharines, Ont. has been calling square dances - and she is still one of the few women in the business.

A square-dancer all her life. Mrs. Easson began to call when she became involved in recreation leadership, first in rural organizations, then in the old community programs branch of the Ontario department of education.

Working in the office, she branched out into games and singing leadership as a hobby. Then she began calling sim-

ple dances she could remember. Without having been taught, she began to teach people to call. "I seemed to remember every square-dance call I ever heard as a child," she said in

an interview. After her husband's death four years ago, she increased her work load. What began as a hobby developed into almost a full-time job.

In fall and winter she calls five or six times a week,

mostly evenings, besides teaching square dancing in some St. Catharines high schools, and calling for a senior citizens' afternoon

In summer, she works at a square-dancing course in New York state. She travels in Ontario and neighboring states and has attended festivals and conventions in Australia, New Zealand, Hawaii, England and continental Europe.

She does all the basic types of calling: The singing call (calling to the tune), the patter of hoedown call (like an auctioneer), and calling for round dances.

When she isn't calling, Mrs. Easson likes to dance "every time anyone asks me." It was only after her husband's death that she realized how much square dancing was geared to couples. It was a shock to find herself so engrossed in an activity where there was so little room for singles.

Every year she hears from women who want to square dance. It is a problem she would like to solve.




