BAHA'U'LLAH, the Messenger of God foretold in the Holy Books has fulfilled the prophecies from Micah, Matthew, John, Revelations in the Holy Bible and the prophecies of the Holy Books of other religions.

All the great religions had messengers from God — Krishna, Buddha, Zoroaster, Abraham, Moses, Christ, Mohammed and all prophesied the coming of The Glory of God in 1844. All teach the same basic laws of God but each brings Social Laws for His age.
