## Youth hostel to operate again

A youth hostel will operate again this summer at the Prince George school district's student residence, 665 Wainwright St.

The hostel will be open from July 3 for nine weeks, and will be operated by supervisor Norm Williams and a staff of four.

Anyone 19 and over can stay at the hostel for a maximum of three nights. There is an 11 p.m. curfew. The hostel has room for about 50 men and women, including some semi-private rooms holding two and five to a room and a men's dorm with accommodation for 30.

There is one men's wing and one women's wing. The overnight fee for members of the Canadian Youth Hostel Association is \$2 and \$2.75 for non-members.

The fee includes breakfast and dinner, but not lunch. The hostel is closed from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m.

Youth hostel memberships can be bought at the Wainwright hostel for \$12.

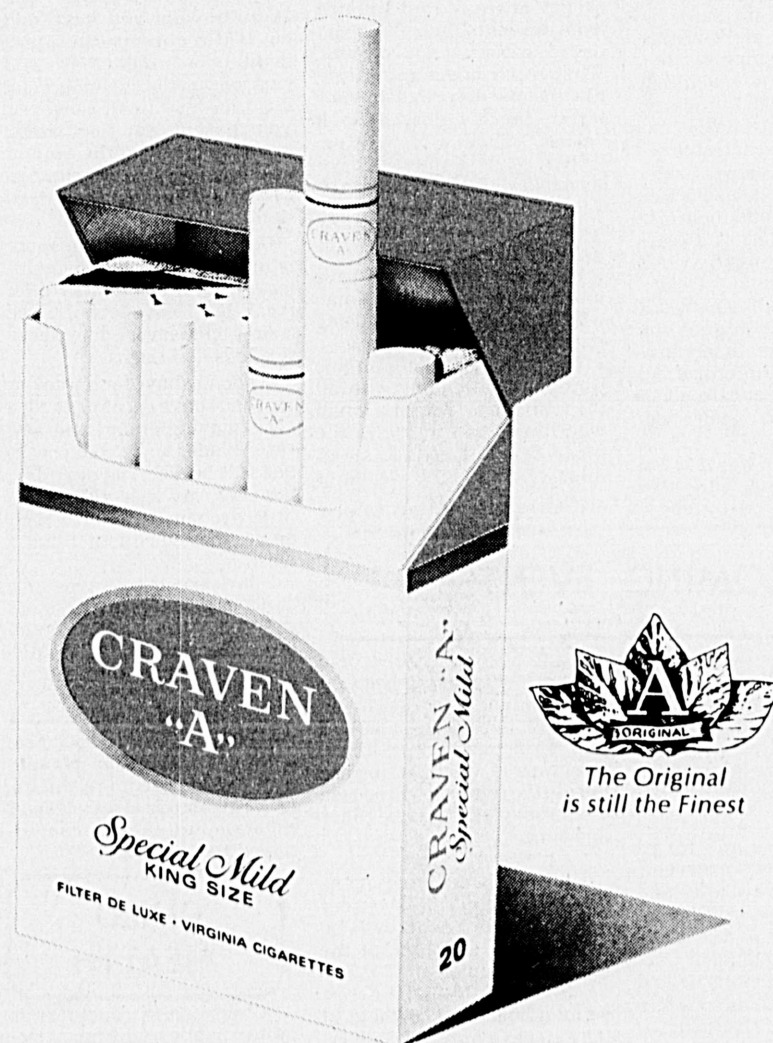
