Nicky Cruz, the evangelist who experienced alcohol, drugs, and brutal violence before turning to Christ, is in Prince George this weekend.

Cruz will be speaking to two Youth Happenings' Friday and Saturday at 7:30 p.m. at the Sports Centre in the Exhibition Grounds.

He will also hold a question and answer session at the same location at 2 p.m. Saturday.

Once the leader of the fierce New York street gang, the Mau Maus, he told the story of the loneliness and frustration he felt as a Puerto Rican teenager in his best-selling autobiography, *Run Baby Run*.

He was also the inspiration for David Wilkerson's *The Cross and the Switchblade*. Wilkerson was the evangelist responsible for helping redirect Cruz's life.

Since his conversion to Christianity, Cruz has travelled around the world spreading the word of Christianity and counselling many young people.

Once told: "You're on a one-way street to jail, the electric chair and hell," Cruz now says "Before I met Jesus, I was just putting years into my life — now, I'm putting life into my years."

Cruz has written six books including his latest, *The Magnificent Three*, which speaks frankly about his close relationship with the Trinity.

He is now involved in establishing a counselling network including youth outreach centres, to offer guidance and shelter to troubled young people.

Cruz is being brought to Prince George by the recently-formed Prince George Youth For Christ committee.

Mormons claim historic equality

TORONTO (CP) — While some continue the battle for women's rights, others accept the equality which they say historically always has been theirs.

They are the women of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints (Mormons) who say they took their equal place beside men when the Church was founded in 1830.

They are educated, aware, influential, talented and valuable, says Barbara Smith, president of the 1.4 million members of the Mormon Relief Society.

The society is an organization of Mormon women over the age of 18 who are involved in charitable works.

The women are about to be honored for their services to communities across the world. A monument to women will be opened June 28 in Nauvoo, Ill., former headquarters of the Mormon church and founding city of the relief society.

"Women have always been recognized as valuable and important and they have become more important, especially today," Mrs. Smith said in an interview.

"They fill social, emotional and spiritual needs — strengths women need today more than ever before."

"We think it's important to show the many aspects of women's lives and the scope and breadth of their work. This monument is a tribute to them."

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Newly-formed church has 'few supporters'

TORONTO (CP) — Despite its claim to jurisdiction in Canada as well as the United States, the newly-formed Anglican Church of North America (ACNA) will gain few supporters in Canada, the head of the Anglican Church of Canada says.

Archbishop Ted Scott said that "there is little chance for expansion in the Canadian situation."

The break-away group is claiming a North American membership of more than 10,000 clergy and laity and has announced a mid-year goal of 100,000 members.

In Canada, three Anglican clergy have defected to the new church and four congrega-

tions in Ottawa, Winnipeg, Edmonton and Victoria have affiliated with it. Total Canadian membership numbers no more than 150.

Archbishop Scott has written to the three defecting clergy asking them that, if they must leave, to join a major branch of the Catholic church instead of ACNA.

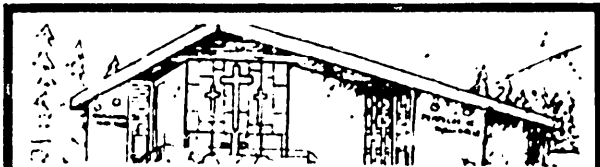
