Asbestos warning issued

department is preparing a warning for doctors with patients who may have been exposed to asbestos.

The director general of the environmental health directorate, Manie Somers, said Tuesday the department is processing a letter for the Canadian Medical Association warning physicians to look closely at the occupational histories of their patients.

Asbestos inhaled can damage lung cells and tissues and has long been regarded as an occupational hazard.

Recent government actions have included guides limiting worker exposure to the substance, consumer protection laws and recommendations by expert committees and study

However, health officials are concerned about asbestos usage years ago because asbestos-related diseases, in-cluding cancer do not gener-ally show until 20 years after

For example, Somers said, about 10,000 Canadians are estimated to have worked in the shipbuilding industry during the Second World War when

asbestos was used in ships. Physicians should be checking for such exposure when interviewing patients.

The department warning follows a similar letter sent to a half million American physicians by the United States health department.
Efforts were made earlier

this week in the Commons to provide government protection for federal workers exposed to asbestos more than 35 vears ago.

SUDBURY, Ont. (NP) -Inco Metals Co. workers who have been on strike since Sept. 15 have been unloading 23 tons of herring from the West Coast for distribution to the workers' families


Dave Patterson, president of Local 6500, United Steelworkers of America, said union members can pick up their herring when they collect strike aid vouchers during the week.

The union will give about 17 pounds of herring to workers with large families and five to seven pounds to smaller

The herring is a gift from unionized fishermen in British Columbia, who voted at a recent B.C. Federation of Labor convention to help the striking Inco workers.

The International Woodworkers' Union also participated in the effort by helping transport the fish.

Last week, the company and union resumed talks in Toronto for the first time since about 11,700 workers went on strike. Talks have been adjourned until Sunday.


