With San Francisco '49ers' victory

Sunday, the last of the goose-eggs in the win column vanished from the National Football League standings and Tampa Bay's record remained safe for one

"We felt sure we were going to win this, from the kickoff to the final gun,' quarterback Steve DeBerg said after guiding the '49ers 70 yards in the fourth quarter to their winning touchdown in the 20-15 victory over Atlanta. Paul Hofer scored it with 5½ minutes to go, his second TD of the game.

"We've been working too hard and losing too many close ones to let this one get away," added DeBerg, who completed all six passes he threw in the winning march

Freddie Solomon scampered 56 yards on a reverse while Hofer scored on runs of two and three yards. The latter run wiped out the Falcons' lead built on Rolland Lawrence's 41yard TD run with a blocked punt earlier in the fourth quar-
