

## Son's jail term paid by parents

SALT LAKE CITY, Utah (AP) — The parents of an 18-year-old Salt Lake County man are paying to keep their son in jail here instead of in Seattle, Wash.

Maryanne and Ivan Burnett agreed to pay at least \$23.88 a day while their son, Corey, serves a 180-day sentence he received in King County Superior Court on June 5.

The Burnetts thought it was worth the expense to have their son serve in Salt Lake City, where they could be near him, rather than in the King County Jail, said Carl Nemelka, their attorney.

Nemelka said he could find no other cases in the country where a person agreed to pay for his incarceration.

"My research indicated it had never been done anywhere — primarily because no one wants to pay their way in jail," he said.

The Burnetts have paid the county \$1,432 for the first 60 days of their son's jailing. Nemelka said the remainder will be paid when he completes the sentence.

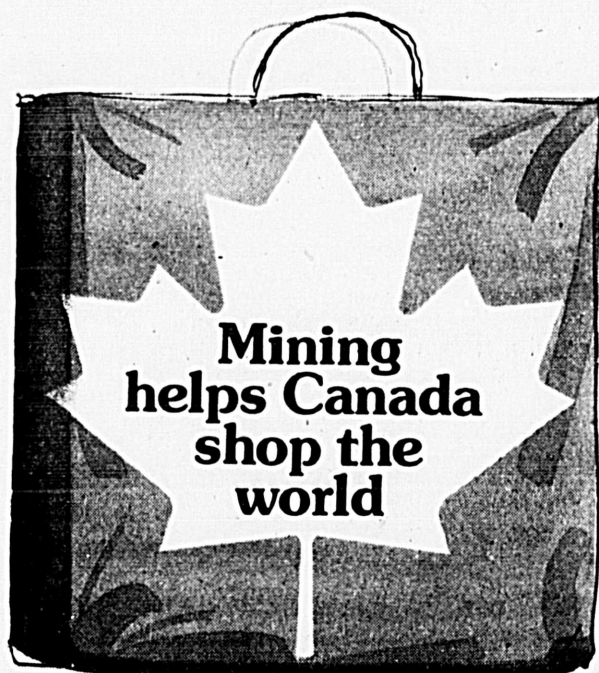
Their son was convicted of negligent homicide in a 1980 traffic accident which killed three passengers in his car and a woman in another car, Nemelka said.

At the time of the Seattle area accident, Burnett was 17 years old and had not yet graduated.
