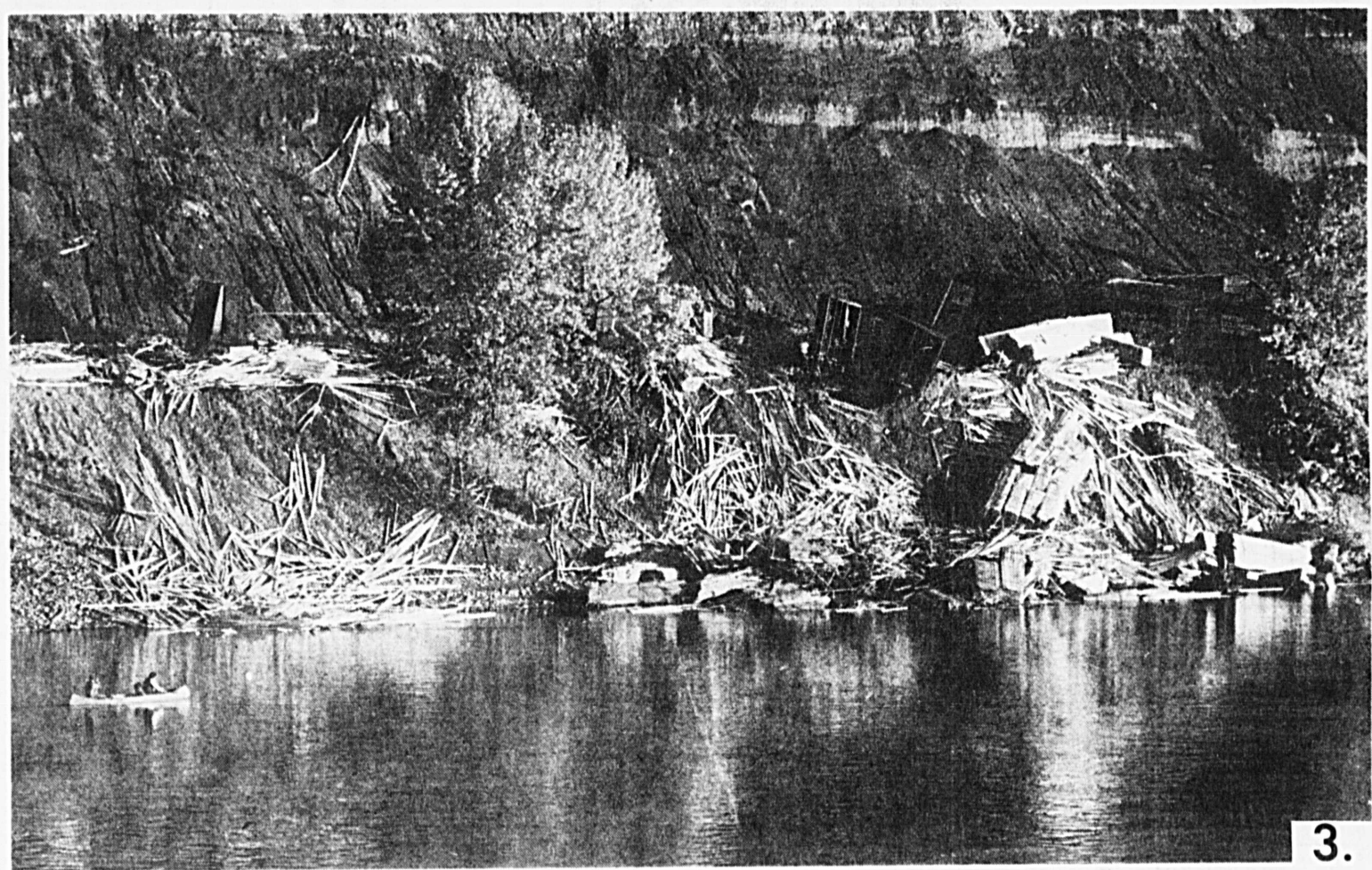

PHOTO 1: Laura Ann Cutway, 17, became Queen Aurora in January and later represented the city in the Miss Canada Pageant.

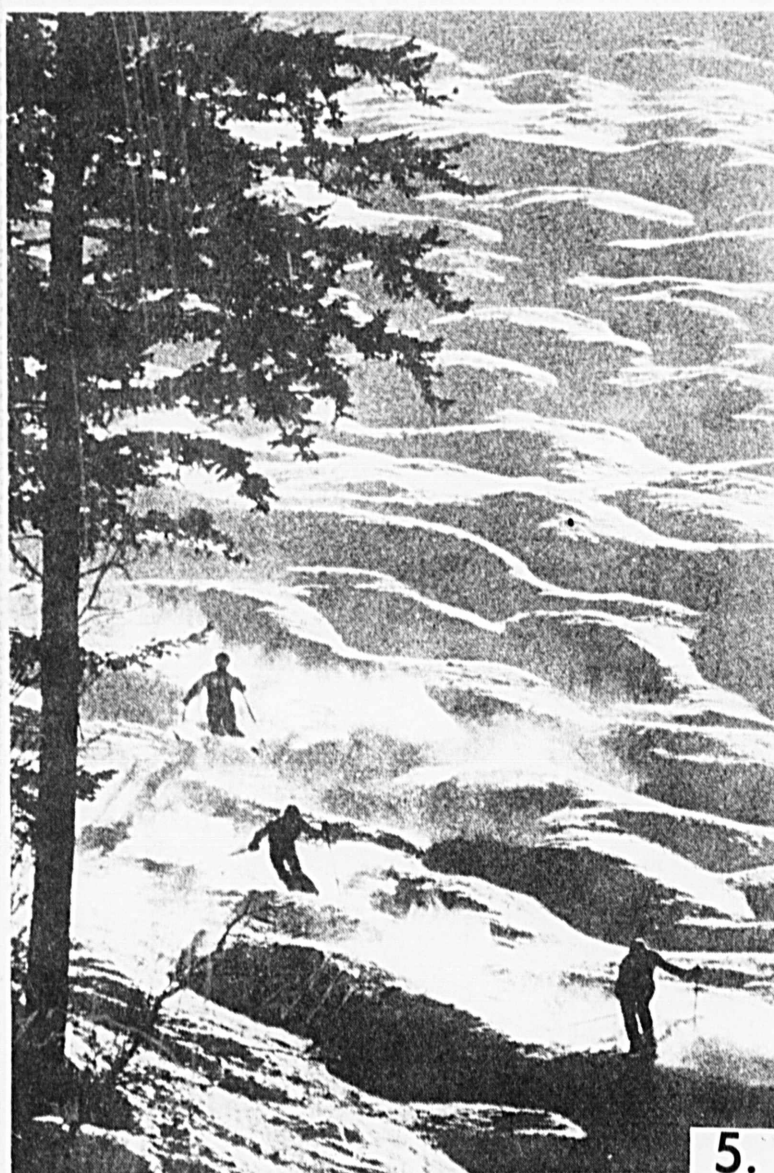
