

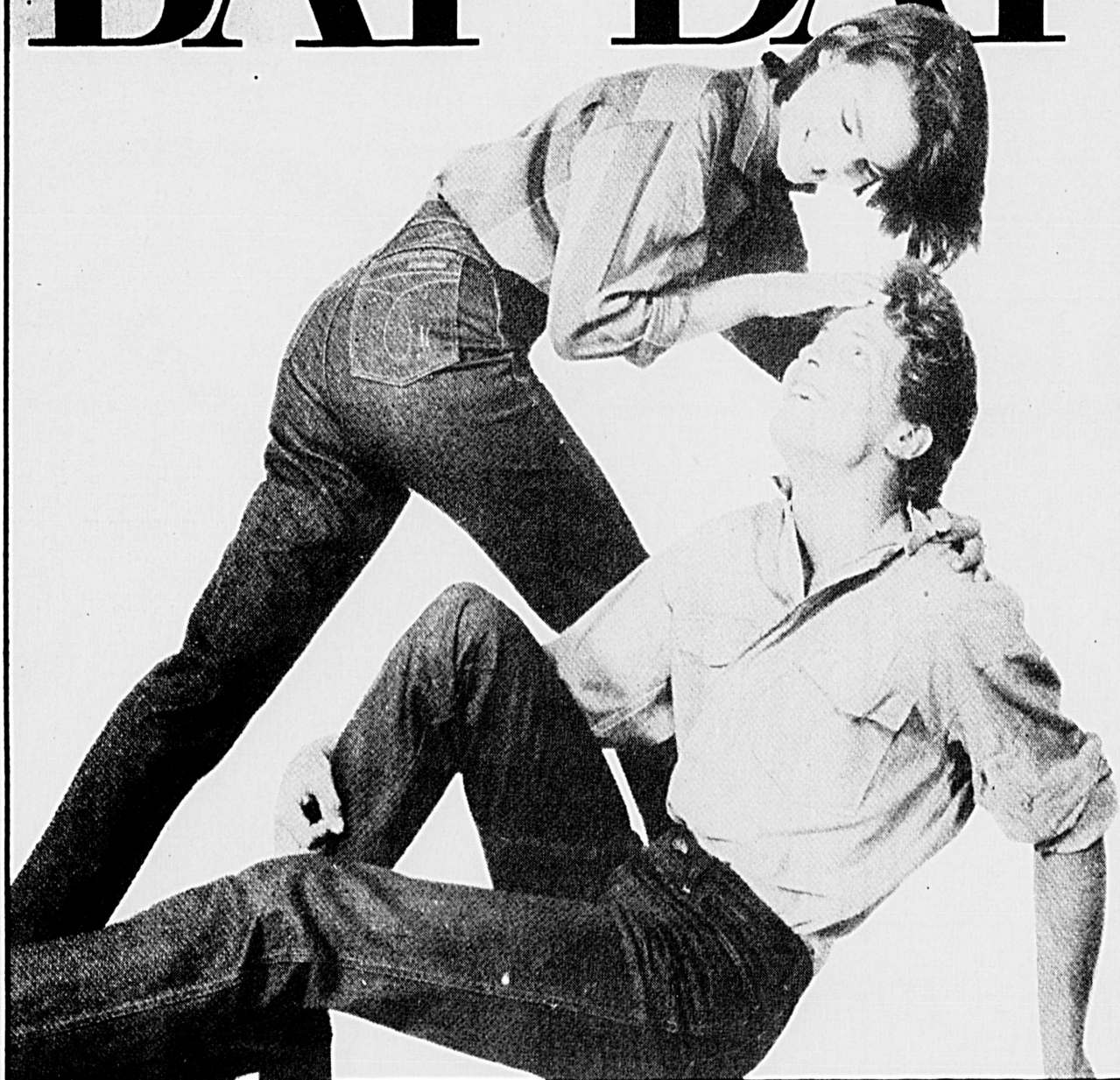

(B.C.R. Industrial Area)

PUBLIC NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Council of the City of Prince George intends to proceed with the final passage and adoption of "B.C.R. Industrial Area Road Closure By-Law No. 4455, 1984" at the Regular Council Meeting scheduled to be held in the Council Chambers of City Hall, 1100 Patricia Boulevard, Prince George, B.C. on Monday, October 1st, 1984. Prior to reconsideration of the aforementioned By-Law, Council will at 8:30 p.m. on the date and location hereinbefore specified, hear those persons who deem their interest in property abutting the roads are affected by said By-Law.

The By-Law provides for the stopping up and closing to traffic of those roads contained within District Lots 745 and 747, Cariboo District, shown outlined in heavy black on the plan prepared by J.B. Salmon, B.C.L.S., dated September 21st, 1983 and attached to the By-Law as Exhibit "A". The City further intends to petition the Minister of Municipal Affairs to have title to the closed roads vested in the name of the City for subsequent conveyance to the adjacent property owner in return for valuable consideration.

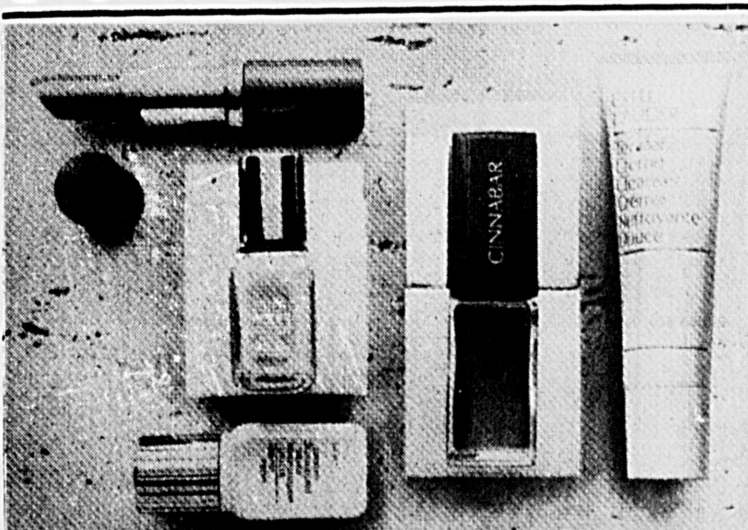
