NEW YORK (AP) — Michael Spinks, who outpointed Larry Holmes on Sept. 20 to become the first light heavyweight to defeat a heavyweight champion, was named fighter of the year Thursday by Boxing Scene magazine.

NEW YORK (AP) — Running back Joe Morris of the New York Giants was named offensive player of the week Thursday by the Washington Redskins the conference's defensive player of the month Thursday by the National Football League.

Morris rushed 104 times for 542 yards and 10 touchdowns in the final four games of the season to finish with 1,336 yards and league-high 21 touchdowns.
Marley, a defensive end, helped the Redskins win three of their final four games to finish 10-6. He had 20 tackles, including three sacks to finish the season with a club-record 15 sacks.

NEW YORK (AP) — Running back George Rogers of Washington was named offensive player of the week and safety Dwight Hicks of San Francisco the defensive player of the week Tuesday by the National Football League's National Conference.

Rogers rushed 34 times for a club-record 204 yards and a touchdown in the Redskins' 27-16 victory over St. Louis. Hicks had a humble recovery, an interception and six tackles in the 49ers' 31-16 victory over Dallas.

In the American Football Conference, wide receiver Stephane Page of Kansas City was named offensive player of the week and defensive end Mark Gastineau of New York Jets the defensive player.

Page caught eight passes for a league-record 309 yards and two touchdowns in the Chiefs' 38-34 victory over San Diego. Gastineau had four solo tackles, three assists, one sack, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery in the Jets' 37-10 victory over Cleveland.
