- On an average day in 1985, 2,657 items were checked out of the Prince George Public Library. An equal number were checked in.

WHAT YOU'LL FIND AT THE LIBRARY

The public library's collection of 180,408 items includes:

- Hardcover books from the latest bestsellers to reference books and almanacs.
- Magazines from People and Time to Bon Appetit and B.C. Business.
- Children's books, magazines and records — from babies' Board Books to pre-teen paperbacks.
- Teen books from science fiction and fantasy to romance and mystery, in hardcover and paperback format.
- Multi-lingual books for those who read a language other than English, the library provides books in many languages.
- Records from Mozart to Madonna, records are also available for all ages and tastes.
- Audio books for people who are unable to read because of a physical or mental handicap, there are audio books available on cassette tapes.
- Large print for people who have difficulty reading regular print, books are available in large type-face print.
- Government documents, legal reference books, business information guides and much more.
