Canada's involvement significant

WASHINGTON — Canada's membership in the Group of Seven industrialized countries is a "very major achievement" and should not be downplayed because the five biggest members still meet separately on their own, Finance Minister Michael Wilson said Sunday.

Wilson's comments came after the so-called G-7 group — the United States, Japan, West Germany, France, Great Britain, Italy and Canada — held its first official meeting since being formed earlier this year.

The meeting, which Wilson said covered some five hours, took place Saturday. The day before, the Group of Five (excluding Canada and Italy) met for seven hours.

A communique issued after the G-7 meeting indicated that members had failed to reconcile fundamental differences between the U.S. on one side and Japan and West Germany on the other concerning the need for the U.S. to reduce its staggering fiscal deficit and for the others to trim their interest rates to promote economic growth.

The weekend's meetings resulted only in a bland communique reflecting the need for the countries to monitor each others' economic performances and to meet again to solve their problems.

"It's clear from the communique that no action is planned at this point," Wilson said.

"The countries involved will be reviewing the situation on an ongoing basis and if at some stage in the future action is required, action will be taken.

"I think it's important to realize that every time finance ministers meet — whether the Group of Seven, the International Monetary Fund or whatever — it doesn't mean that immediately following these meetings actions have to occur. Sometimes the best action is no action: letting things happen, letting the results of past actions take their course."

Wilson said the Group of Seven meeting had a wider agenda than was covered in the Group of Five meeting and that Canada made a positive contribution.

"I think the fact that Canada is in the Group of Seven — the seven leading industrialized countries in the world — is a very major achievement.

"We recognized at the Tokyo Summit that there would be meetings from time to time of the Group of Five. . . I think there's nothing unusual about what has happened."

It was at Tokyo that the G-5 nations agreed to include Canada and Italy in their economic discussions.

Prime Minister Brian Mulroney heralded it at the time as a major breakthrough for Canada in the international sphere.

The Tokyo agreement had followed a meeting a year ago at the Plaza Hotel in New York of the G-5 countries which resulted in a major pact to co-operatively reduce the value of the U.S. dollar against other currencies. Canada, Italy and other nations were not consulted, despite widespread implications for their economies.

After Tokyo, Mulroney said "there will be no more Plaza Hotel meetings that exclude Canada."

Other meetings have taken place in the meantime but none with the impact of the Plaza meeting.

Canadian officials here said the deal made in Tokyo was being adhered to. From all indications, the weekend G-5 meeting reached no more substantial agreement on co-ordination of global economic policy than did the G-7, so on outward appearances at least, the deal still stands.

Wilson said Canada had submitted a report to the other G-7 countries embodying ideas of how the organization ought to run.

In particular, he said, ideas were proposed on a common tracking of economic indicators — something the major industrial countries have pursued for some time — and what the strengths and weaknesses of such a tracking system would be.

The document will be considered by officials of the member countries.

"I would hope it will form the basis for further action," said Wilson. "That, from a Canadian perspective, is a positive development. The report was well received."

Wilson is also attending other multilateral meetings here this week in conjunction with the joint meetings of the International Monetary Fund and World Bank.
