

Chilean burn victim going home

MONTREAL (CP) — Two years and 10 days after she was brutally beaten, doused with gasoline and set on fire by Chilean soldiers, Carmen Quintana will do as she always vowed — leave Montreal and return home.

"I'm not afraid," the 20-year-old said recently as she talked about her plans to go back to university to study sociology. "With what they've already done to me, there's not much more that can happen."

Quintana — once a strikingly beautiful university student, now scarred for life — has endured more physical and emotional pain than most people can imagine.

After two years, 16 operations in Chile and another 13 here, her physical appearance has improved significantly. And she has become much more relaxed and self-confident.

But she is still too self-conscious about her appearance to wear shorts, sleeveless shirts or a bathing suit.

Her greatest fear is the possibility her physical appearance will prevent her from marrying and having children.

The nightmare that changed her life began on the morning of July 2, 1986, a national day of protest against the military dictatorship of Chile's Gen. Augusto Pinochet. Quintana had met friends who were preparing to burn some old tires — a popular form of protest.

Suddenly, they were surrounded by soldiers, who grabbed her and Chilean-born American resident Rodrigo Rojas De Negri, who was in Chile on a visit.

After setting them ablaze, the soldiers wrapped them in a blanket, threw them in the back of a truck and dumped them in a ditch 20 kilometres away.

Rojas died of his burns four days later, but Quintana defied medical odds and survived.

That September, after pressure from Chileans in Cana-

da and a Roman Catholic organization, Development and Peace, Canada allowed her and her family to come to Montreal. Quebec agreed to pay for her medical treatment.

But for Quintana, the stay in Canada was to be temporary. Even before her flight landed in Canada, she vowed she would return to her homeland as soon as her treatment was over.

It ended June 11, when, after two final operations and her 227th day in hospital in Canada, she walked out of Hotel-Dieu Hospital for the last time.

At 7 p.m. today, Carmen and sister Marcela, 18, will fly from Dorval to Toronto then on to Santiago.

Their air fares are being paid by the United Nations High Commission for Refugees.

BC Rail has obtained a Pesticide Control Act Use Permit #134-055-88/90 for the use of any of the following pesticides: SPIKE 80W, SPIKE 5G, GLEAN, KROVAR I, and SIMMAPRIM NINE-T to control herbaceous vegetation on railway yard tracks and around railway yard buildings.
