CONGRESSIONAL COMMITTEE**U.S. to probe Gander crash**

OTTAWA (CP) — A United States congressional committee will conduct an inquiry into the controversial 1985 air crash in Gander, Nfld., the Ottawa Citizen says.

The paper said the development marks the first time American authorities will thoroughly examine the cause of the aviation disaster which killed 248 U.S. soldiers and eight Arrow Air crew members.

The chartered DC-8 jet was ferrying U.S. soldiers home from Middle East peacekeeping duties when

it stopped in Gander on Dec. 12, 1985 to refuel; it crashed 20 seconds after takeoff. There were no survivors.

New Jersey Rep. William Hughes, a 15-year veteran of Congress, is the driving force behind the new investigation.

Hughes, chairman of the House of Representatives subcommittee on crime, is dissatisfied with the Canadian investigation of the crash.

His press secretary, Mark Brown, said Wednesday that

Hughes has decided the matter is important and merits public hearings in Washington.

"His staff has been looking into this crash for the last couple of months now," Brown said. "He just felt it was a subject that deserved some formal review in Congress."

Investigators for the 10-member subcommittee have already begun work for the hearings, which are expected to begin within the next month.

Those likely to be called include: investigators and board members from the Canadian Aviation Safety Board, eyewitnesses to the crash and family members of the victims.

The Canadian board was split on the cause of the crash. Most members agreed with investigators that a thin coating of ice on the wings was the probable cause.

A minority panel concluded an on-board explosion — either an accident or a terrorist bomb — was at fault. There have been a series of allegations — the most recent raised last week on the ABC TV newsmagazine 20-20 — the crash was connected to the Iran-Contra affair and the White House covered up this information.

These matters are likely to be investigated by Hughes' subcommittee, Brown said.

"It's the questions which still remain out there that have gotten him interested in it."

Hayden Gregory, chief counsel for the subcommittee, said Wednesday he has been hard at work preparing a background file.

He said he has been reviewing material submitted to the subcommittee in recent days and gathering new documents from government agencies.

The congressional body is authorized to investigate U.S. criminal matters and terrorist activities. Gregory said the subcommittee has full power to subpoena witnesses and documents from within the U.S.

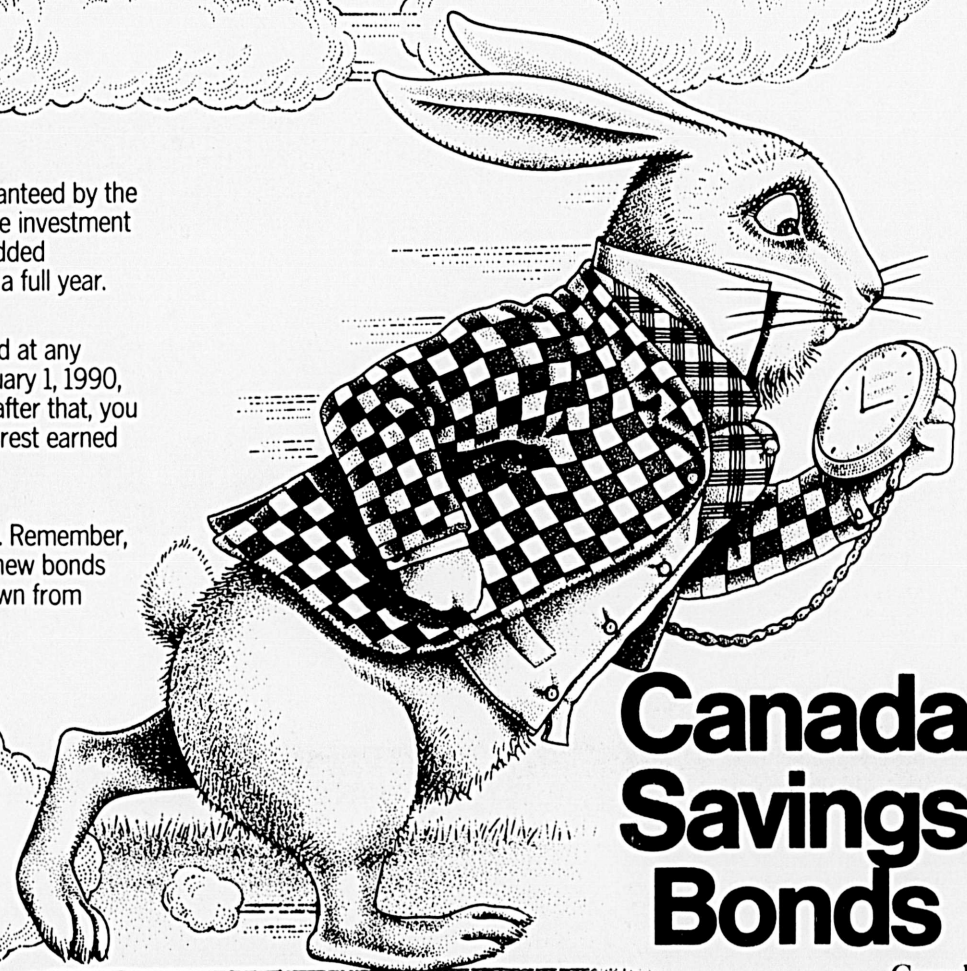
