**BOSNIA AIRLIFT ON HOLD**

**Team to discuss aid plan**

OTTAWA (CP) — Although Canada wants to help victims in the war-ravaged city of Sarajevo, it wants to deliver aid where it's most needed, External Affairs Minister Perrin Beatty said today.

A team will be sent to Bosnia to discuss with officials on the scene how Canada can best help.

"We hope to be sending a team to Bosnia very shortly, within the next couple of days, to meet with international authorities to talk to them about how we can best be of assistance," he said in an interview on CBC Newsworld.

In the last week there have been calls for Canada to fly out sick and injured people from Bosnia for treatment in Canada. Prime Minister Kim Campbell has mused about sending a Canadian military field hospital to the region.

Beatty said these options are still being considered but he wants to hear from officials on the ground.

"At the end of the day, the key for Canada is to contribute in whatever way the community feels is most useful."

He said European countries, by virtue of their proximity to the scene, are in better position for medical evacuation, although Canada is still prepared to fly out 20 injured Bosnians. The timing remains to be worked out.

"We'll look at it on a case-by-case basis," he said. "Certainly Canada's offer still stands."

Beatty said Canada has been in the forefront in both peacekeeping and humanitarian aid for the former Yugoslavia.

There are about 2,300 Canadian peacekeepers in the Balkans and Canada has earmarked \$38 million in aid money for Bosnia.

"No country, relative to its resources, has been more generous than Canada has."

The minister also said that Canada is prepared to back stronger action by the international community if peace talks under way in Geneva fail and fighting continues in Bosnia.

He said NATO has been very clear in threatening air strikes against Bosnian Serb forces if they continue their conquests.

"Whether or not there are air strikes will depend upon the behavior particularly of the Bosnia Serbs," he said. "If they stop the pressure that they're putting on Sarajevo, if they begin to respect the rights of the Muslims, then air strikes won't take place."

"But if we don't see progress being made... then it's necessary for the international community to take further steps."
