Photos reflect profound concepts of God

NEW YORK (AP) — Eleven-year-old Kristen pictures God as a shadow -"blurry, because nobody has a clear image of him.

Rebecca, 8, sees God in the smile of a little boy blowing out the candles on a cake.

"Here's proof that there's God," she says. "This boy has never smiled like this before. This is a part of God, a nice and happy one."

In the March issue of Life magazine, children not only talk about God, they show pictures they took. The results of their photographic journey reveal a personal God who guides young people through the mysteries of life, from the inevitability of death to the realities of cancer and child abuse.

Life religion editor Robert Sullivan said it was interesting to see that religious concepts usually ascribed to adults "are in the minds of kids as well. They're smarter than you think.'

The magazine gave cameras to 56 children aged eight to 13, in settings ranging from a small town in Texas to a camp for critically ill children in New York, and asked them to capture their own images of the Divine on film.

Some kids came back with traditional pictures of churches or the sky, but many shot photos that showed God much closer to issues they were dealing with in their lives.


