On a night that featured an endless stream of odd-man rushes and 21 goals, the Detroit Red Wings defenceman still managed to do what he does best. The Swede finished with an amazing plus-7 rating to lead by example on a team carrying his name.


Even though Team Lidstrom beat Team Staal 11-10 on Sunday, a big part of the post-game discussion centred around the future Hall of Famer's defensive skills.

"He picked the winning team and was plus-7 so that's a pretty good night for Nick Lidstrom," said Eric Staal.

The Carolina Hurricanes captain held his own by scoring twice, but his team wasn't able to take advantage of home ice advantage and the support of a sellout crowd.

The league went with a different format for this year's game — putting the power in the hands of the players by having captains Staal and Lidstrom select the teams. While it seemed pretty popular with the participants and created some new buzz heading into the weekend, it didn't have much impact on the game itself.



Back in the hunt

Sunday win moves Kings two points out of playoff spot

It's been easy to write off the Prince George Spruce Kings as potential playoff contestants this season.

They've been the bottom-feeders of the B.C. Hockey League since the season began in September.

Well guess what, they're now only two points out of a playoff spot.

The Spruce Kings shook off an 11-4 hammering Saturday night in Salmon Arm and fired right back into the thick of the playoff race with a 4-1 win Sunday afternoon in Merritt.

Kirk Thompson put up a wall in front of the Kings nets, making 47 saves in Sunday's victory over the Merritt Centennials. Dustin Bearisto, Trent Murdoch and Kyle Manlow (into an empty net) were the Prince George triggermen. Evan Stack spoiled Thompson's shutout bid with just 3:03 left on the clock. Kings defenceman Ben Woodley had two assists.

The win left the Spruce Kings (12-36-0-4) two points back of the Quesnel Millionaires (11-33-3-5) for the seventh and final playoff spot in the Interior Conference.

Saturday night in Salmon Arm, the Kings fell behind 3-1 to the Silverbacks after one period and gave up five more in the second and three in the third, leading to their third loss this season in which an opponent scored 10 or more goals.

The Silverbacks outshot the Kings 31-25. Cameron Large played all but 4:13 of the game, giving up seven goals on 19 shots. Thompson allowed four goals on five shots.

Brad Reid scored three times to lead the Silver-

backs, while Bryce Gervais and Paul De Jersey each fired a pair. Prince George midget call-up Sean Landrey, Tye Sanford (a Vernon call-up), Bearisto and Todd Skirving replied for the Kings.

The Spruce Kings and Millionaires each have eight games left, including a head-to-head matchup on Tuesday, Feb. 8 in Quesnel, with similar schedules ahead of them.

The Kings host Nanaimo in their next game this Friday at the Coliseum, then travel to Quesnel, returning home for games against Penticton (twice) and Westside, ending on the road in Merritt, Penticton and Westside.

The Mills play Nanaimo at home on Saturday, then host the Kings, Westside (twice) and Penticton, ending the season with a trip to Westside, Penticton and Vernon.

Since Dave Dupas took over from the fired Ed Dempsey as interim head coach of the Spruce Kings Nov. 25, his record is 6-14-0-2, as compared with Dempsey's 6-22-0-2 mark to start the season. Since the Jan. 10 trade deadline, when the Kings parted company with their top four scorers — RJay Berra, Nic DeSousa, Justin Fillion and Zac Ashdown — as well as 20-year-old defenceman Derek Henderson, they've compiled a 2-3-0-2 record.

■ Fillion, a Prince George minor hockey graduate, scored the game-winning goal for the Victoria Grizzlies, 1:01 into overtime Saturday, to give the Grizzlies a 3-2 triumph over the visiting Penticton Vees. The Grizzlies lost 7-1 Sunday to the Powell River Kings. Prince George native Michael Garteig made 28 saves in the Powell River nets. Garteig is still looking for his seventh shutout of the season, which would tie Brad Thiessen's BCHL season record.

Maxwell leads 'Tips past Cats

EVERETT, Wash. — Tyler Maxwell scored twice, leading the Everett Silvertips to a 4-2 victory over the Prince George Cougars Saturday night in Western Hockey League action. Clayton Cumiskey and Josh Birkholz also scored and Ryan Murray added three assists for Everett (20-23-7), which won back-to-back games for the first time since Dec. 18. Kent Simpson had a strong game in net for the Silvertips, stopping 31 shots. Charles Inglis and Brett Connolly scored for Prince George (24-23-3). Goaltender Ty Rimmer finished with 23 saves. Maxwell's second goal was the clincher late in the third period. Prince George, which trailed 3-0 going into the third, pulled within one with two goals in 20 seconds.

CALGARY — It was a closer game than the night before but the same result as the Calgary Roughnecks swept a home-and-home series with the Edmonton Rush on Saturday night.

Rookie Curtis Dickson notched his second hat-trick in as many nights and Mark Scherman scored the winning goal 2:30 into overtime in Calgary's 12-11 victory.

"I got open around the crease and nobody was really covering me," Scherman said. "(Curtis) Conway made a nice little move and he got the ball to me and I just quick-sticked it and was able to squeeze it in just inside the post."

"I didn't even realize the moment and then the boys all jumped on me there and it was pretty awesome to hear the place going wild."

It was the second goal of the season and just fourth of his career for the 25-year-old.
