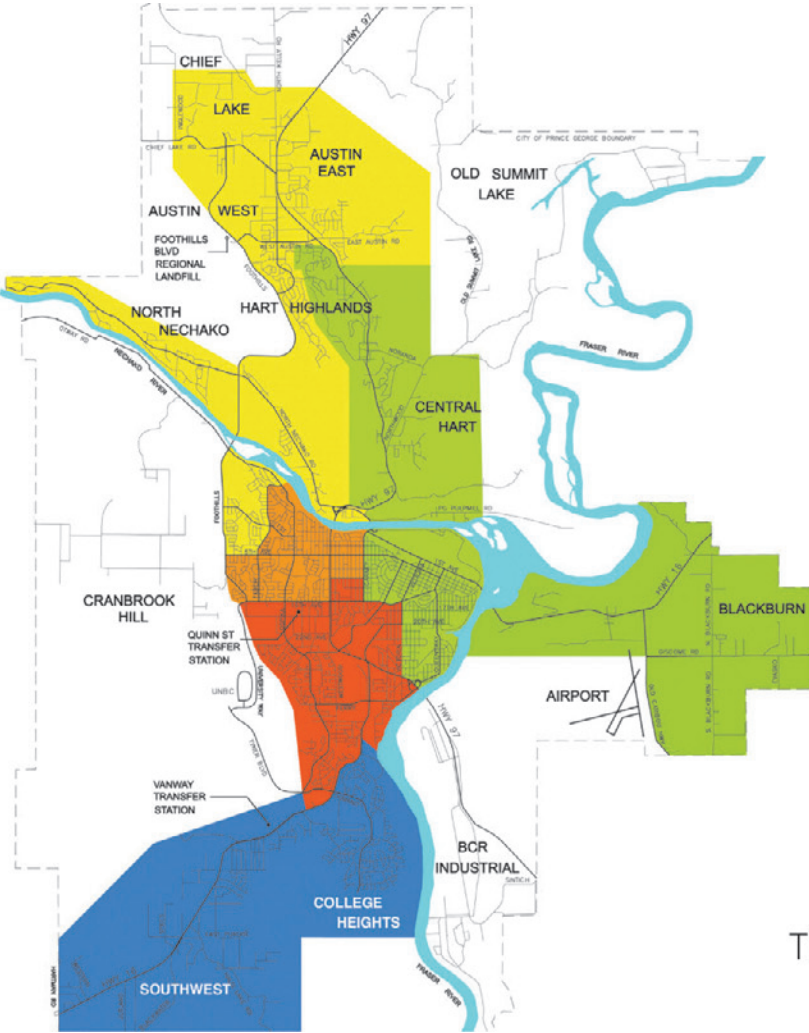
SONG OF THE DAY

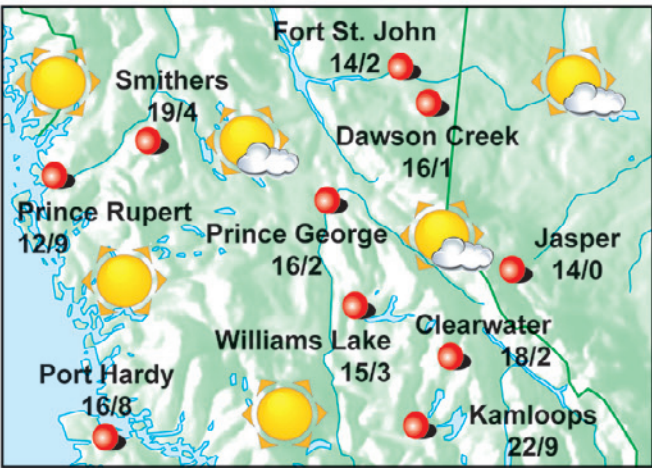

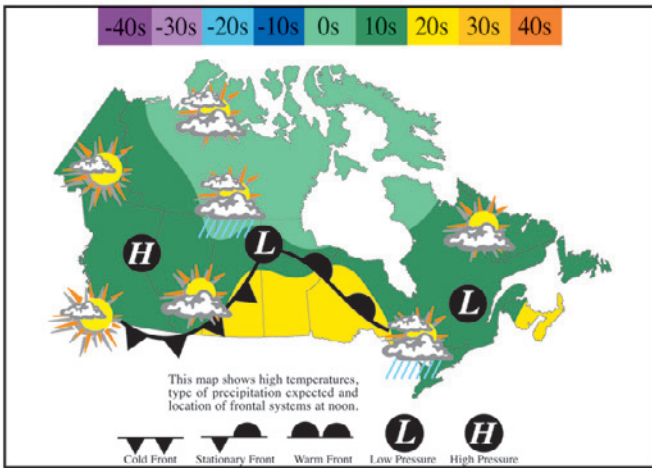
