"Any chef can do something interesting with resources like that. The real skills of a chef are revealed with simple ingredients like peach or avocado."

There was tension. There were jangled nerves on the stage. There was even fire as one chef got distracted and forgot something in the oven.

Oops. But in true competition style, the team worked around that setback and carried on with other culinary creations to impress the judges.

"I think cooking is an art form, whether you are an amateur or a professional," said Beesley when asked by Blumer what drew him to this competition. "I'm interested to see how these chefs deal with time constraints. I know from my own kitchen creations, so much depends on how you time everything out, so the things that are supposed to be hot at the end really are hot at the end." Guest judge Al Moffat couldn't be-

lieve his good luck. There to enjoy the competitive cooking, he got his name drawn to participate from inches away instead of down in the seats.

"Presentation is a big thing for me," said Moffat, a former commercial cook before his career at a local pulp mill. "If something looks good, you expect it to taste good, too."

"There was actually an old quote that says the first taste of food is with the eyes," Blumer agreed.

To see how the preliminary rounds turned out, come to the amateur finals at 2 p.m. Saturday.

The professional chefs have an even larger tournament starting today with events at 1 p.m. and 4 p.m. followed by 11 a.m. Saturday. The ultimate finals happen Sunday at 3 p.m.

# National nod for CNC students

Two CNC students have turned national heads.

Terry Mitchell and Shannon Carlsen, both in their second year of the school's medical radiology technology program, were singled out by the Ottawa-based Canadian Association of Medical Radiation Technologists.

Mitchell won the association's national student essay contest for work where he evaluated the available diagnostic tools, weighing availability, cost and accuracy of diagnosis.

### Don't seek out fires, province warns

The Prince George Fire Centre is reminding people to stay away from active wildfires.

According to fire information officer Jill Kelsh, two public vehicles drove to the head of an active fire while airtankers were overhead and about to drop retardant on Tuesday.

"The aerial attack had to be paused and crews were required to put themselves in front of the fire to ask the public to leave the area," Kelsh said in a written statement. "When the public enters an area of active wildfire during suppression operations they put themselves, our crew and others at risk."

The Wildfire Management Branch reported 21 new fire starts in the expansive Prince George Fire Centre (stretching from the Robson Valley to Fort Nelson) last week. All but one of those fire were caused by lightning. As of Aug. 6, there were another nine new lightningcaused fires and three human-caused fires.

Additional firefighting personnel arrived in B.C. from Ontario and Quebec this week, as

had to be paused and crews were required to put themselves in front of the fire to ask the public to leave the area.

well as extra equipment. An airtanker group from Alberta consisting of four amphibious skimmers, one bird dog aircraft and an air attack officer arrived in Prince George on Monday.

Costs associated with requests for assistance through the Canadian Interagency Forest Fire Centre are covered by the province under the Mutual Aid Resources Sharing Agreement.

So far, the wildfire management branch has responded to 812 fires this season.
