

Break and enters keep courtrooms full

Kyle Drake Baraniuk pleaded guilty to five counts of break and enter and committing an indictable offense therein. He pleaded guilty to one count of break and enter with intent, and one count of assault causing bodily harm. He was sentenced to a total of six months in jail. He was also convicted of one count of forcible confinement and one count of assault causing bodily harm. For those two convictions he got an additional three months in jail.

Alan Raymond Dyck was given a suspended sentence with conditions after he pleaded guilty to one count of break and enter with the intent to commit an indictable offense.

George Richard Johnson got a suspended sentence with conditions after he pleaded guilty to one count of break and enter with intent.

Assault

Michael John Lynn was given a suspended sentence with certain conditions after he pleaded guilty to one count of assault.

Neil Michael Pixon got four months in jail after he pleaded guilty to one count of assault.

Terrance Rudy Jack got a suspended sentence after he pleaded guilty to one count of assault. He also got one day in jail for failing to comply with a condition.

Drinking and driving

Garry Baal was given a suspended sentence and has been prohibited from driving for a year after he pleaded guilty to operating a motor vehicle while disqualified from doing so.

David Albert Richardson pleaded guilty to operating a motor vehicle while disqualified from doing so. He was fined \$500 and prohibited from driving for a year.

Michelle Anne Johnstone pleaded guilty to one count of driving with a blood alcohol level of above .08. She will be sentenced January 18, 1995.

Drugs

Francis Ronald Paquette pleaded guilty to one count of trafficking in a narcotic and got 30 days in jail.

Roderick Aaron Louis got eight months in jail after he pleaded guilty to trafficking in a narcotic.

Tammy Lynn Ripley pleaded guilty to two counts of possession of a narcotic. She got seven days in jail for one charge and 14 days for another. Ms. Ripley was also convicted of refusing to comply

with a condition and she got seven days in jail for that. As well, she pleaded guilty to refusing to attend court and she got three days in jail concurrent with a further conviction for attempting communication for the purposes of prostitution.

Thefts

Sonny Henry Alexander pleaded guilty to one count of theft over \$1000. He was fined \$250.

Darcy Donald Leroy Larson pleaded guilty to one count of theft under \$1000. He was fined \$350.

Lawrence Gairdner pleaded guilty to one count of possessing the proceeds of crime. He got 14 days in jail.

Daniel Roy Lamouche got a suspended sentence for admitting to possessing the proceeds of crime.

Adam Raymond Courture was fined \$100 for possessing the proceeds of crime.

Dane Gregory Hnetka got seven days in jail after he pleaded guilty to theft under \$1000.

James William Coombes pleaded guilty to one count of theft over \$1000 and two counts of obtaining things through false pretenses. He got six months in jail for each count.

Bruce Wayne Mackenzie pleaded guilty to one count of possessing property obtained by crime. He was given a conditional discharge. He was also convicted of failing to appear in court and he was given an absolute discharge.

Pauline Ann Maurice pleaded guilty to two charges of theft under \$1000. She was given a suspended sentence.

Stella Mary Ross got a suspended sentence for pleading guilty to one count of theft under \$1000.

Uttering threats

William Vernon Trefry got six months probation after he was convicted of causing someone to

fear injury or damage.

Hans Van-Battum got 12 months probation after he was convicted of causing someone to fear injury or damage.

Edward Sikorski was found guilty of causing someone to fear injury or damage. He was put on probation for a year and given a \$500 fine.

Miscellaneous

Mark James Debruijn was sentenced to a total of 44 days in jail for failing to comply with a court order. He will spend his sentence at home on the electronic monitoring program.

Karl Kristensen will be sentenced December 30 for escaping imprisonment.



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
