# Taking it to the pitch

## Mueller marvelous for PG Croatia

Free Press staff writer Tien Mueller knows how to score goals.

The 23-year-old striker Prince for George Croatia/Fred Walls in the North Cariboo Senior Soccer League was second in team scoring last season, but exploded during the playoffs.

Now, he's expected to lead Croatia, arguably the strongest team in the NCSSL this season, in goals scored and to a title.

"I'm really looking forward to this season," says Mueller, who moved to Prince George from Terrace in 1986. "We've got some good new players this year."

Mueller's natural position is striker, but with Croatia's four-four-two system, he ends up playing more of a thinking position.

"We still had a good season," says Mueller. "You can't worry about one game. That's behind us now.


Despite the loss to Quesnel, Mueller played some of his best soccer that afternoon. He's hoping to carry that on over to this season.


"I just try and stay open and capitalize on chances," he says. "I'm a striker. I'm always around the net and get a lot of goals. I just keep
