"We're a strong hitting club " Goetken. says "Before, pitching used to be our strong point but now hitting is it."



East rattled at provincials

The rest of the province threw them a curve and Prince George East Little League just couldn't adjust.

The local 11 and 12-year-old all star team won the district title over Freeman Park but lost both of their games at the provincials in East Vancouver.

PG East lost their first game 11-1 in five innings to the eventual champions Kennedy-Surrey and lost their second game 8-5 to the host Victoria Drive team.

"The guys just didn't come to play ball, that's all," says East manager Al Bielinski. "The guys just got rattled. We had Dave LaCasse pitching for us and he hit three batters in the first inning."

LaCasse was the same pitcher that shut down Freeman Park in the district final and gave East an easy mercy rule victory. "You have to be able to pitch and hit curveballs," says Bielinski.
