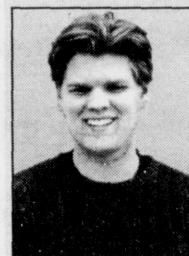

## Musical talent... visual energy

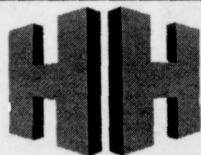

Broek's background includes attending The University of British Columbia where he studied composition and conducting. His studies in music have also taken him across the world from Vancouver to The Czech Republic, and this

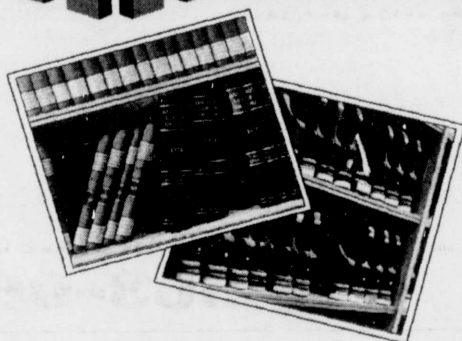
