Ron A. Schentag has been fined \$3,385 and is prohibited from possessing firearms for 10 years on a charge of cultivating a controlled substance.


Valorie D. Swenson has been given a four-month conditional sentence and is prohibited from possessing firearms for 10 years on a charge of cultivating a controlled substance
