Breach

Nathan R. Craig has been ordered to serve a one-year suspended sentence on a charge of breaching a probation order.

Sherry V. Greene has been ordered to serve a six-month suspended sentence and must pay a \$50 Victim Services surcharge for breach of probation.

Drugs

David B. Collin has

been fined \$150 on a charge of possessing a controlled substance.

Raysa L. Coumont has been ordered to serve a six-month suspended sentence on a charge of possessing a controlled substance.

Norman W. Hoffmeister has been fined \$4,025 on a charge of cultivating a controlled substance.

Sarak Pal has been ordered to serve a day in jail, must pay \$6,676.23 in restitution, and is prohibited from possessing

firearms for 10 years on charges of cultivating a controlled substance and possessing a controlled substance for the purpose of trafficking.

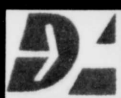

Great strides have been made in treatment over the past five years - but HIV/AIDS is not going away.

In this new millennium

- 50,000 Canadians are living with HIV/AIDS
- 4,500 new cases are identified each year
- 15,000 Canadians are living with HIV but are unaware they are infected
- 30% of all positive HIV tests are the result of heterosexual experiences

- 75 people have sought the help of AIDS PG
