U-PASS REFERENDUM

The Students' Union has served notice that the U-Pass program will be going to referendum in the beginning of February.

The City has asked for a \$.88 per month increase in the U-Pass fee. Students currently pay \$13.50 a month, or \$54 a semester for the service, which grants unlimited access to public transit in PG, as well as admission to the PG Aquatic Centre and the Four Seasons Pool. With the increase, the fee would come to \$14.38 a month or \$57.52 a semester.

Any fee increases for the U-Pass program must be approved by the student body at CNC, according to policy and the Students' Union's contract with the City.

The referendum will be held from the 4th to the 6th of February
