## The Confluence - Feature

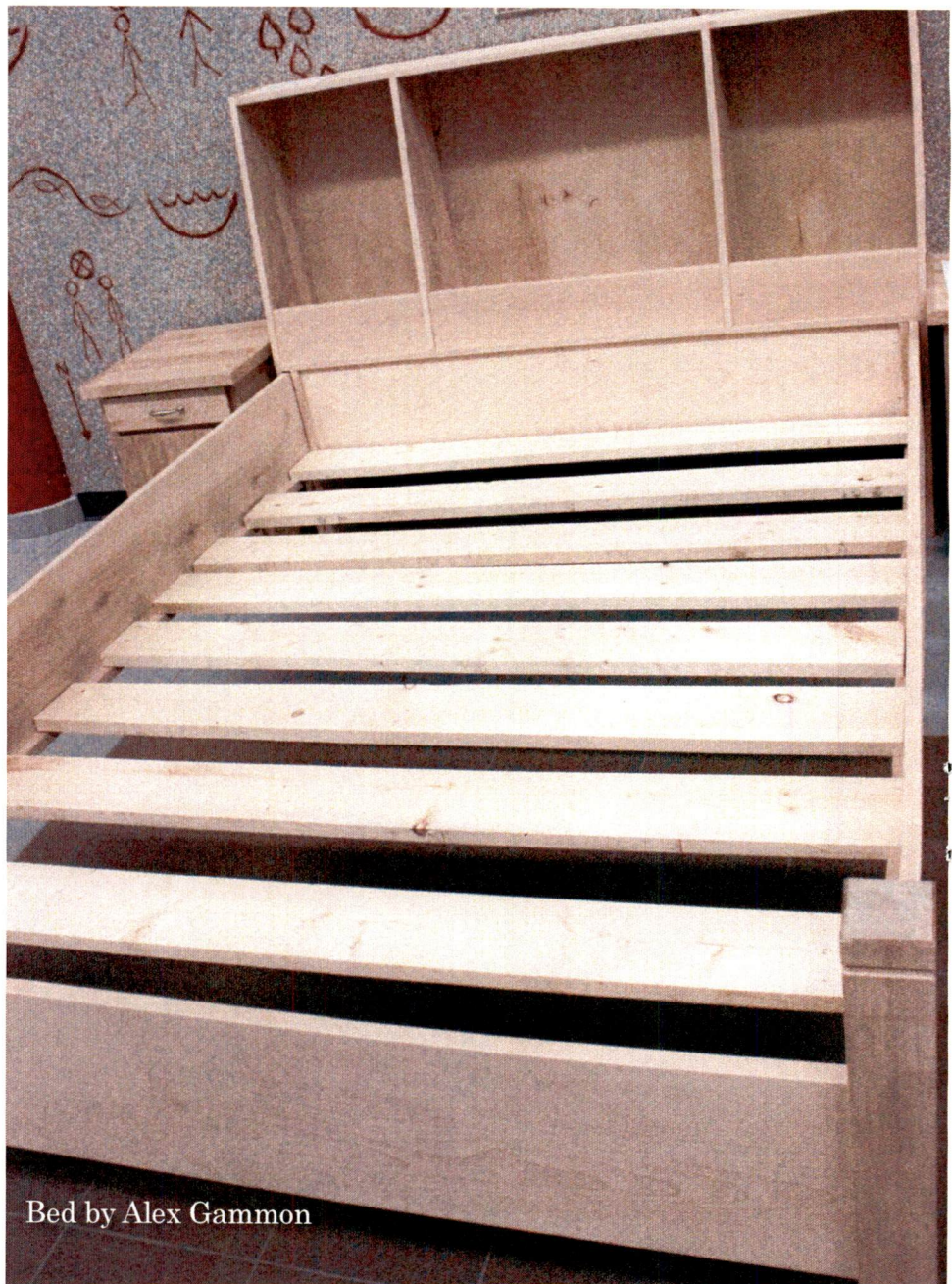

Dillon was able to get scraps of exotic hardwoods from his job at a plywood store, and also made a custom fly case from exotic woods.

Other projects undertaken by the class included kitchen utensils, puzzles and saddle racks.
